## NATIONALITY (FEES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS (NO.2) 2024

*Laid before Tynwald: 18 June 2024**Coming into Operation: 01 July 2024*

The Governor, with the consent of the Treasury<sup>1</sup>, makes the following Regulations under 68(1), (7) to (10), (12) and (13) and 69(1), (2) and (4A) of the Immigration Act 2014 (of Parliament)<sup>2</sup> as that Act has effect in the Island<sup>3</sup>.

### 1 Title

These Regulations are the Nationality (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations (No.2) 2024.

### 2 Commencement

These Regulations come into operation on 01 July 2024<sup>4</sup>.

### 3 Amendment of the Nationality (Fees) Order 2020

- (1) The Nationality (Fees) Regulations 2020<sup>5</sup> is amended as follows.
- (2) In Schedule 1 (nationality), in Table 2 (fees for applications, processes and services in connection with nationality), in the third column (amount of fee) of —
  - (a) row 2.1.1, for “£250” substitute **£400**;
  - (b) row 2.2.1, for “£372” substitute **£450**;
  - (c) row 2.3.1, for “£80” substitute **£130**; and
  - (d) row 2.4, for “£250” substitute **£400**.

*EXPLANATORY NOTE**(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations amend the Nationality (Fees) Regulations 2020 (SD 2020/0074) to increase the fees charged for the following services connected with nationality:

- application for amendment of a certificate of registration or naturalisation to rectify an error;
- application for review of an application for a certificate of registration or naturalisation which has been refused;
- arrangement of a citizenship ceremony; and
- supply of a certified copy of a notice, certificate, order, declaration or entry.

These Regulations maintain the Island's alignment with the UK in matters relating to nationality fees.
