

Shipping forecast for the North Irish Sea

Synopsis: A temporary ridge of high pressure covers the area today before frontal troughs

arrive later tonight.

Wind: Northwest 4 or 5, decreasing west or northwest 3 or 4 this evening, then backing

west or southwest 3 to 5 tomorrow morning.

State of Sea: Mainly slight.

Weather: Rain clearing the southeast at first, then mainly fair, until rain and drizzle arrives

from the west overnight.

Visibility: Good, occasionally moderate or poor in rain later.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Wind: West or southwest 4 occasionally 5, veering northwest 5 or 6 during Monday

afternoon, decreasing 4 or 5 overnight into Tuesday.

State of Sea: Slight becoming slight or moderate on Monday afternoon for a time.

Weather: Outbreaks of rain and drizzle, becoming fair Monday evening.

Visibility: Moderate or good, occasionally poor in the rain or drizzle becoming good later on

Monday.
